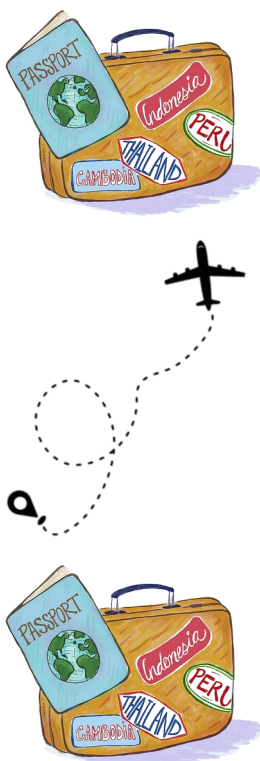
BACK THIS YEAR BRING A FRIEND TO CAMP DAY!!

Saturday, June 17th, 2023

On Saturday, June 17th, all Scouts are encouraged to invite a friend to camp for the day! Guests will be able to participate in all camp activities along with their Cub Scout friends! Why not invite your best friend to travel *Around the World in Three and a Half Days* to show him or her just how FUN and EXCITING camp can be! Cost is only \$10.⁰⁰ per guest, to cover meals and supplies. Guests must be in 1st through 5th grade (their grade in school this coming fall), and all first-graders **MUST** be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Guests must register prior to the first day of camp (see enclosed registration form). All guests must complete Parts A and B of the BSA Health Forms, and bring these with them to camp.

Guest registration is **DUE no later than Friday, June 2nd, 2023**

CUB SCOUT SUMMER ADVENTURE FEES

	<u>Overnight Camp*</u>	<u>Day Camp ONLY</u>
<u>Early Bird Fee:</u> (Paid in full by May 12 th)	\$170. ⁰⁰	\$130. ⁰⁰
<u>After May 12th:</u>	\$220. ⁰⁰	\$180. ⁰⁰

Additional adults (non-Staff) and youth (non-Scouts) who attend each day are welcome at \$20.⁰⁰ per person total. This includes Tiger Adult Partners. For additional guests who stay for the day and overnight, a fee of \$45.⁰⁰ total per person will be charged. Non-staff adults and siblings who are only staying overnight will be charged \$5.⁰⁰ per evening to camp overnight.

(Does not include Sunday — no charge to visit camp on Sunday. Sunday's meal is charged separately.)

Adults who volunteer their time to serve on Staff are eligible to receive a discounted campership for their Cub Scout — \$60 total for day campers and \$75 total for overnight campers — a savings of almost 60%!! We will accept the first 15 adults who apply to take advantage of this offer.

Pack leadership will still be needed during camp.

*****One discounted campership per family*****

***Wolves and Bears may stay overnight with one adult parent or guardian per Scout.**

Webelos/AoL can stay overnight with two-deep Pack leadership or one adult.

Tiger Scouts MUST be accompanied by an adult at all times.

ARRIVAL, DEPARTURE & OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION!

~ Families and Packs are responsible for their Scout's arrival at the Kinzua Heritage Festival Grounds, 4047 Fox Hill Rd. in Russell.

~ On Thursday, June 15th, 2023 ONLY, we will follow a staggered registration and check-in schedule to avoid congestion. This schedule will be sent to you prior to the first day of camp. Please arrive ON TIME at your Scout's scheduled arrival time. We ask that you do not arrive early to avoid confusion and congestion during the registration process. Please do your best to arrive on time, as late arrivals disrupt our schedule.

~ Our day will start each morning at 9:00 A.M. with a flag ceremony.

~ We will conclude each day at 4:00 P.M. at which time those participating for the day only will return home.

~ The Cub Scout Summer Adventure will conclude on Sunday afternoon after the closing program and luncheon.

~ Scouts **may not** check-out or leave our event at any time with anyone but their parents unless we have written permission given to us before the day they will be picked up. Visitors arriving with verbal permission to take Scouts from camp will not be permitted to do so. Please do not disappoint the Scout by making such arrangements.

~ In the event of an emergency, families may leave our event at any time, but **must** check-out with the Camp Director before leaving.

It is our #1 goal to keep everyone as safe as possible during their stay.

FINANCIAL AID

If your Scout would like to attend the Cub Scout Summer Adventure, but is financially unable to do so, you may request "Financial Aid" from the Council. It is the policy of the Chief Cornplanter Council that no Scout will be kept from a Scouting activity due to financial need. If your Cub Scout has a financial need and participated in the Council's Fall fundraiser, s/he may be eligible for financial aid. You may request a Financial Aid form from the Betts Scout Service Center.

FACILITIES

Each family or Pack staying overnight needs to "provide their own tents. **Only family members are permitted to sleep in the tents with their own Scouts.** Youth sharing tents must be **no more than two years** apart in age. Male and female "youth may NOT share tents unless they are siblings or otherwise related (such as cousins). Shower facilities will also be available in the evenings.

" **NO cook stoves or campfires are permitted without expressed permission from the Camp Director!**

All Scouts and leaders **MUST** have **Parts A & B** filled out in order to attend camp. Immunization history is required. Anyone who stays more than 72 hours must **ALSO** have Part C completed by a health care provider physician, physician's assistant, or nurse practitioner).

Health forms must be renewed each year.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from Cub Scout Summer Adventure is the responsibility of the parents and/or guardians of the Scouts. Please drive safely and observe all laws.

Refund Policy - Fees for the Cub Scout Summer Adventure are NON-REFUNDABLE, unless written notice is received in the Betts Scout Service Center two (2) weeks prior to the start of the activity. Emergency cancellations (less than two weeks) due to death in the family, illness, severe injury, or other unforeseen circumstances will be handled on a case by case review. No refund requests will be considered after the Cub Scout Summer Adventure has begun. Fees may be transferred to another Scout (camper) within the same unit. No refunds will be made for early check-out or non-participation. Staff members who do not fulfill their required staff duties **must pay full camp fees** for their Scout's participation.
